The show took place on November 12th at the Platte River Mall which was so generously donated to us. The mall's generosity allowed us to reach so many more people than we did last year. We had a record crowd of 140 visitors this year!

The art show had 44 participants, and their projects were nothing short of amazing! We had everything from decorated popsicle sticks to rugs made out of woven trash sacks to pictures made from tiny cut outs of magazine papers. The art pieces truly showed our community what really can be done with things that would otherwise end up in a landfill.
